

Para-badminton inclusion process history

When	What
2008	BWF puts para-badminton as a priority
2009	BWF bid to IPC for the 2016 Rio Paralympic Games
2010	BWF becomes an IPC Recognized International Organization
2011	Para-badminton is integrated into the BWF and significant increase in funding and a clear and strategic approach was made
2012	Para-badminton is integrated into the BWF Strategic Plan – 2012 – 2016 and a new classification structure was produced
2013	General Competition Regulations for parabadminton agreed
September 2013	IPC confirms criteria / process for selection of 2020 sports
March 2014	BWF submits proposal to the IPC
October 2014	IPC selects para-badminton for the 2020



2010

Para-badminton from a multi para-sports organization to specific sports assoiations. (forced by National Sports Federation).

First 3 years - 50% co-financing

From 2013 - fully integrated

Challenges



- Small numbers less than 1% of your members
- Board members, employees, officials, badmintonclubs not familiar with para-badminton and disabled people.
- Specific requirements (customized rules, classification, etc.)
- Small numbers nationwide, locally even smaller
- Where and how to find para-badminton players?
 - Multisport clubs
 - Badminton clubs
 - Specific organizations (example Short Structure)
 - Rehabilitation centers



- Integration board, employee, commission, clubs (25), money, pocesses, enthusiastic people, strategic plan, about 200 players
- National squad (10) Coach, international tournaments
- Events National Championships (bidprocedure), 6 tournaments
- Classification National team, international classifier (funded by National Sports Federation)
- Training Training for coaches bodied players (in development)
- Promotion/communication clinics, newsletters, website, plan for clubs, partnerships schools, rehabilitation center, local authority

Where we started:



1980's:

- Leaders' Awards (Disabilities)
- Disability Working Group
- Costed development plan
- Mistakes made
- Consequences: unaffordable
- Result: Project abandoned



What next?



- Limited work until funding became available
- Disability Manager appointed
- Disability Strategy created
- Strategy recognised that funding would limit activity



Ownership and Partners



Commitment by Badminton England's Board of Directors

National Para-Badminton Committee established

Broad membership including players



Who the strategy covered



- Commitment varied across disability spectrum
- Pathways for players varied: BWF classifications Participation - Competitive structure – England representation
- Intellectual disability Participation Competitive structure
 - Other impairment groups Participation



Increasing participation



- Target of 28 inclusive clubs by 2017 (already exceeded)
- Inclusive clubs: investment, support and guidance.
- Inclusive clubs: monitored, evaluated and rewarded
- Participation targets span a wide range of disabilities

- 5 tournaments supported in the 2013-2014 season (about 90 players)
- Future competition structure per annum
- 2-4 tournaments including a minimum of 2 classifications
- 2 tournaments in which all classifications are included.
- 4 Nations (ENG, SCO, IRL and WAL) circuit (volunteer run)
 - An International event of some sort (subject to available funding)



England Representation



- Selection policy agreed for England teams
- A squad of players established
- Squad training led by Badminton England coaches
- GB representation process yet to be decided



Things we have changed



"Inclusivity" now embedded in Badminton England

- Competition structure reflects the number of players
- We are moving to selected squads.



Lessons we have learnt



- Limited focus ensures affordability
- "Buy in" at the highest political / strategic level is necessary
- Single point of contact v collective ownership
- Set realistic targets
- Need for effective partnerships
- Be aware of the fear factor and prejudice
- Manage expectations sympathetically
