





Overall TRENDS

- TREND 1: General decrease of European players/pairs on all levels and in all events
- **TREND 2**: Europe is still able to develop a decent number of players/pairs into the top 200
- **TREND 3**: Europe is still able to develop players/pairs who can compete up to the top 50 level on the world ranking
- TREND 4: Europe is struggling to compete for top 10 spots and top 20 spots in all events meaning the chances of winning medals at the World Championships and Olympics are getting smaller and smaller

When we meet again in 10-15 years time, how do we ensure these trends has changed to the better?




